Grading Rubrics for Pictology Event Evaluation (Juniors)		
Criteria	Description with Grading Scores	
Participation	Participation (1): Awarded for participating in the event.	
Scoring	 Correct (4): The participant correctly guesses the correct answer. Partially Correct (2): The participant guesses a word close to the correct answer. 	
Bonus Scoring (Based on Time Slots for Completion)	 Completion during time Slot 1 (4): The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 1 Completion during time Slot 2 (3): The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 2 Completion during time Slot 3 (2): The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 3 Note: The bonus points are not applicable if the regular score (i.e., the score obtained as per the criteria "Scoring") is less than 50% of the maximum attainable score. This it to prevent the participants who answer incorrectly from bagging the bonus points. 	

<u>Time Slots:</u> The Time slots shall be decided based on the available time. A possible division is 20%, 40% and 60% of the total time allocated. Eg.: If the event's duration is an hour, the slots are 00:00 - 12:00, 12:01 - 24:00, and 24:01 - 36:00.

Grading Rubrics for Writing Event Evaluation (Super seniors and Seniors)	
Criteria	Description with Grading Scores
Spelling and Grammar	 Excellent (5): Well structured sentences with no spelling or grammatical mistakes. Good (4): Few or minor spelling or grammatical mistakes, but the writing is clear and easy to understand. Needs Improvement (2): Many spelling or grammatical mistakes and incomprehensible.
Creativity	 Excellent (5): Original content with very creative and engrossing ideas. Good (4): Interesting with some degree of creativity. Needs Improvement (2): Lack of creativity and originality and not engrossing.
Content Organization	 Excellent (5): The writing is well-structured with a clear introduction, development and conclusion. Ideas flow logically, making it easy to follow. Good (4): The writing is somewhat organized, with some logical flow of ideas. Needs Improvement (2): The writing is disorganized and difficult to follow, with no clear structure or a logical progression of ideas.
Following the Prompt	 Excellent (5): The writing thoroughly addresses the writing prompt with a clear focus on the topic. Good (4): The writing partially addresses the writing prompt but occasionally wanders off-topic, or lacks depth. Needs Improvement (2): The writing does not effectively address the writing prompt, lacks a clear focus on the topic or misses key aspects of the prompt.

Engagement and • Good (4): The speaker engages the audience to some extent Connection but fails to use techniques to create a stronger emotional connection. • Needs Improvement (2): The speech lacks audience engagement, making it difficult for the audience to connect with the message. • Excellent (5): The speaker manages the time effectively without significantly exceeding or falling short of the allotted Time Management Good (4): The speaker goes slightly over or under the allotted time, without however significantly affecting the speech. Needs Improvement (2): The speaker delivers a speech that is significantly too long or too short.
