Judging criteria: Student's understanding of the theme, innovation, shade technique, detailing and overall presentation. Separate judging for juniors, seniors and super seniors.

PAINTING

Event Rules:

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only an A3 sheet will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be an hour.

PENCIL SKETCHING

Event Rules:

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only an A4 sheet will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be an hour

EGG SHELL PAINTING

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 15 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- An Egg shell will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be 30 minutes

Judging criteria: Student's understanding of the theme, innovation, shade technique, detailing and overall presentation. Separate judging for juniors, seniors and super seniors.

PAINTING

Event Rules:

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only an A3 sheet will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be an hour.

PENCIL SKETCHING

Event Rules:

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only an A4 sheet will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be an hour.

COLLAGE

- This is a group event (2 students per group).
- A maximum of 3 groups from each house.
- A total of 24 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- A newspaper and glue will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participants.
- Duration will be an hour.



EVENT CATEGORY Arts (SUPER SENIORS)

Judging criteria: Student's understanding of the Theme, innovation, shade technique, detailing and overall presentation. Separate judging for juniors, seniors and super seniors.

BALL PEN SKETCHING

Event Rules:

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only an A4 sheet will be provided. Other necessary items are to be brought by the participant.
- The sketch should be done with a single colour only.
- Duration will be an hour.

FABRIC PAINTING

- Event Rules:
 - This is an individual event.
 - A maximum of 5 students from each house.
 - A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
 - Participants should be present at the venue 10 minutes before the event.
 - Topic will be given on the spot.
 - Only a piece of white fabric will be provided. Other necessary items (such as poster colours / fabric paints, etc.) are to be brought by the participant.
 - Duration will be an hour

Event Rules:

SOAP CARVING

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 5 students from each house.
- A total of 20 students can participate from each category.
- Participants should be present at the venue 15 minutes before the event.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- Only a soap will be provided. Other necessary items (such as cutter, compass, pencil, knife, sand sheets, etc.) are to be brought by the participant.
- Duration will be an hour.



EVENT CATEGORY

(JUNIORS, SENIORS & SUPER SENIORS)

THE THINKING DUO- "A Quiz Game"

<u>Prelims</u>

Duration: 30 minutes

- Any junior, senior, super senior from any house can attend.
- Will be an individual round.
- Questions will be general
- Among the participants, from each house, top 2 in junior, senior, super senior will be selected.
- Each team will be combination of either junior-senior (or) juniorsuper senior (or) senior-super senior, which will be decided by the Quiz master on lot basis.
- A Total of 3 teams per house will be reaching finals.

<u>Finals</u>

Duration: 1 hour 30 minutes

Round 1:

- The event will be SPEAK OUT LOUD "One will dictate and the other would be a listener wearing headphones with loud music"
- Two phases will be conducted.
- At the end of phase 2 four teams will be eliminated based on points.

Round 2:

- The event will be UNIQUE SPECIALISATION- "Each team will get a unique topic from which 10 questions will be asked"
- Topics will be given on lot basis,
- At the end of Round 2 four teams will be eliminated based on points.

Round 3:

- The event will be CONNECTION "Pictures slide will be projected, everyone should find the sentences by connecting them.
- Three Phases will be conducted.
- Phase 1 and phase 2 has pass options
- Phase 3 will be buzzer round



Judging criteria: Choreography, theme (or) property, energy and innovation.

EVENT CATEGORY Culturals (JUNIORS, SENIORS & SUPER SENIORS)

Flying Feet – "Solo Dance Event"

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 2 students from each category can participate.
- Juniors will be given 3 minutes, seniors and super seniors will be given 4 minutes.
- A foot loose round might be included, at the judges' discretion.
- Participants should bring their songs in MP3 format in a pen drive, and a back-up in an Audio CD.
- Participants without a proper working MP3 format audio will be disqualified.
- The audio track should be name in the format <PARTICIPANT_NAME>_<JUNIOR/SENIOR/SUPERSENIOR>_<HOUSE
 NAME>. Eg.: RAVI_JUNIOR_CHAWLA
- The Pen drive / Audio CD is to be brought to the Alumni office on 13/10/2023, between 12:00 PM and 4:00 PM. After copying the audio file, the Pen drive / Audio CD will be returned.
- No Pen drive / Audio CD shall be collected after 4:00 PM on 13/10/2023.
- Lot numbers will be allotted at the discretion of the event coordinators.
- Participants should strictly follow the allotted lot numbers. Any schedule overlap or discrepancy noticed is to be brought to the notice of the event coordinator by the Teacher-in-charge, at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the event.

- This is an individual event.
- A maximum of 2 students from each category can participate.
- All the participants will be given 3 minutes.
- The participants must bring their own instruments or instrumental music (karaoke) for their performance in a Pen drive.
- Karaoke is mandatory.
- Participants should bring their audio track in MP3 format in a pen drive, and a back-up in an Audio CD.
- Participants without a proper working MP3 format audio will be disqualified.
- The audio track should be name in the format <PARTICIPANT_NAME>_<JUNIOR/SENIOR/SUPERSENIOR>_<HOUSE NAME>. Eg.: RAVI_JUNIOR_CHAWLA
- The Pen drive / Audio CD is to be brought to the Alumni office on 13/10/2023, between 12:00 PM and 4:00 PM. After copying the audio file, the Pen drive / Audio CD will be returned.
- No Pen drive / Audio CD shall be collected after 4:00 PM on 13/10/2023.

- One team from each house can participate.
- A team should consist of at least one student from each category.
- A team will be given 6 minutes, which includes the time to set up.
- The teams can perform a play, a mime, a mimicry, a standup comedy, a group dance, etc.
- Participants should bring their songs in MP3 format in a pen drive, and a back-up in an Audio CD.
- Participants without a proper working MP3 format audio will be disqualified.
- The audio track should be name in the format <PARTICIPANT_NAME>_<JUNIOR/SENIOR/SUPERSENIOR>_<HOUSE
 NAME>. Eg.: RAVI_JUNIOR_CHAWLA
- The Pen drive / Audio CD is to be brought to the Alumni office on 13/10/2023, between 12:00 PM and 4:00 PM. After copying the audio file, the Pen drive / Audio CD will be returned.
- No Pen drive / Audio CD shall be collected after 4:00 PM on 13/10/2023.
- Lot numbers will be allotted at the discretion of the event coordinators.

EVENT CATEGORY Tami (JUNIORS)

Sorkalagam <mark>(சொர்க்கலகம்)</mark> An Oral Event

- <u>Individual Event</u>: This competition is designed for individual participants, meaning that each student competes on their own, showcasing their unique speaking skills.
- <u>Maximum Participants</u>: A maximum of 4 students per house are allowed to participate in the event. This limitation ensures that the event is manageable and allows for a diverse range of participants.
- <u>Minimum Standard Representation</u>: To encourage participation from a variety of standards (grade levels), it is mandatory to have a minimum of one student from each standard. This requirement promotes inclusivity and diversity in the competition.
- <u>Speaking Duration</u>: Participants are expected to deliver a speech on a given topic, either FOR or AGAINST it, within a maximum time frame of 120 seconds (equivalent to 2 minutes). This time limit challenges participants to be concise and articulate in their presentations.
- <u>On-the-Spot Topics</u>: The topics for speeches will be assigned on the spot, meaning participants will receive their topics at the event itself. This element of surprise adds excitement and tests the participants' ability to think and speak on their feet.
- <u>Topic and Order Determination</u>: Topic can be chosen by the participant from the given options once available. Order of opportunity will be done through random picking of lot.
- Judges will evaluate the quality of each participant's delivery, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation process.
- <u>Disqualification</u>: Anything (language / gesture / etc.) not deemed decent by the judges will lead to immediate disqualification.



EVENT CATEGORY Tami (SENIORS)

Judging criteria: Content of the speech, pronunciation and presentation skills.

Dharkam (தர்க்கம்) – An Oral Event

- <u>Individual Event</u>: This competition is structured as an individual event, where each participant presents their viewpoints independently, highlighting their distinct speaking abilities.
- <u>Maximum Participants</u>: A maximum of 4 students per house are allowed to participate in this event. This limitation is in place to ensure the event remains manageable while still accommodating a diverse group of participants.
- <u>Minimum Standard Representation</u>: To promote inclusivity and encourage participation from various standards (grade levels), it is mandatory to have a minimum of one participant from each standard. This requirement ensures that a broad spectrum of students can engage in the event.
- <u>Speaking Duration</u>: Participants are expected to address a given topic from both perspectives: FOR and AGAINST. Each participant has a total speaking time of 3 minutes, allowing them to present both sides of the argument within this timeframe. This requirement challenges participants to be concise and persuasive in their presentations.
- <u>On-the-Spot Topics</u>: Topics for speeches will be provided on the spot, adding an element of surprise to the event. Participants will receive their topics at the event itself, testing their ability to think critically and articulate their thoughts spontaneously.
- <u>Topic and Order Determination</u>: The assignment of topics and the order of speaking will be determined by drawing lots. This random selection process ensures fairness and eliminates any potential bias in topic allocation and speaking order.
- Judges will evaluate the quality of each participant's delivery, ensuring a comprehensive and fair evaluation process.
- <u>Disqualification</u>: Anything (language / gesture / etc.) not deemed decent by the judges will lead to immediate disqualification.



EVENT CATEGORY Tamil (super seniors)

Judging criteria: Creativity, persuasiveness, communication and presentation skills.

Vilambara Idaiveli (விளம்பர இடைவெளி)

- <u>Team Event</u>: This competition is designed to be a team event, with each teamconsisting of three members. Participants collaborate within their teams to create and present their advertisements. This event provides a dynamic platform for Super Senior participants to work together in a team, demonstrating their creativity and communication skills in designing and presenting advertisements while adhering to language guidelines and time constraints.
- <u>Maximum Number of Teams</u>: A maximum of 3 teams per house are eligible to participate in this event. Each team consists of a maximum of 3 members. This limit ensures that the event remains manageable while allowing a diverse set of teams to engage.
- <u>Minimum Standard Representation</u>: To encourage participation across standards (grade levels), it is mandatory to have a minimum of at least one team member from each standard. This requirement promotes inclusivity and ensures a broad range of participation.
- <u>Advertisement Duration</u>: The duration of the advertisement should be for a minimum of120 seconds (2 minutes) and a maximum of 180 seconds (3 minutes). This duration constraint challenges teams to convey their message effectively within the specified timeframe.
- <u>On-the-Spot Topic</u>: Teams will receive their advertisement topic on the spot, introducing an element of spontaneity to the event, showcasing their ability to think creatively and respond quickly.
- <u>Topic and Order Determination</u>: Topics for advertisements and the order of performance will be decided through a random drawing of lots. This random selection process ensures fairness in topic assignment and performance order.
- <u>Language Requirements:</u> All the contents of the advertisement, except for the product's name, should be presented in Tamil. The use of English words within the advertisement will result in negative points. The product name should be unique.
- <u>Content Evaluation</u>: Participants will be judged primarily based on the content of their advertisement. Judges will assess the creativity, persuasiveness, and effectiveness of the advertisement.
- <u>Query Session</u>: After each team's performance, a query session will be conducted, allowing judges to ask questions and teams to provide further insights or explanations about their advertisement.
- <u>Equal Team Participation</u>: Team members must ensure that all members actively participate in the advertisement creation and presentation. Equal participation among team members is encouraged.
- <u>Disqualification</u>: Anything (language / gesture / etc.) not deemed decent by the judges will lead to immediate disqualification.



EVENT CATEGORY ENGLISH (Juniors)

A PICTURE AND A THOUSAND WORDS

Event rules:

- Event type: Pic-tology
- This is an individual event.
- Participants will receive a set of pictures for each question and must associate the pictures to guess the correct word that connects them.
- Duration: Varies As quick as the candidate can complete. Max duration is set at 1 hour for the event.
- Participants Requirement: A minimum of 2 students per house from each standard (totaling to a minimum of 8 students per standard), and a maximum of 4 students per house from each standard (totaling to a maximum of 16 students per standard).

(Seniors)

OH, HOW THE TURNTABLES...

- Event type: Writing
- This is an individual event.
- A pool of prompts will be presented to the candidate on the spot.
- Participants are allowed to choose two prompts from the prompt pool.
- Participants must write a short story that incorporates both prompts while maintaining a balanced emphasis on each.
- Duration: 1 hour
- Participants Requirement: A minimum of 2 students per house from each standard (totaling to a minimum of 8 students per standard), and a maximum of 4 students per house from each standard (totaling to a maximum of 16 students per standard).
- Grading Rubrics: Legible and presentable handwriting is a must.

EVENT CATEGORY ENGLISH (Super Seniors)

Event rules:

- This is an individual event, and it consists of 2 rounds.
- The first round is a qualifier round and it will be a writing event.

THINK, INK and TALK

- Participants are allowed to do a lucky draw and select a slip with a topic/scenario/quote on it.
- Each participant gets 30 minutes to write on the prompt obtained through the lucky draw.
- The second round will be the final round, and it will be a speaking event.
- Participants are given 4 topics from a pool of topics.
- The participant can choose one topic and speak on it for about 3 minutes.
- Duration: 1.5 hours (30 mins Writing Qualifiers + 30 mins Assessment Duration + 30 mins Speaking Finals)
- Participants Requirement: A minimum of 2 students per house from each standard (totaling to a minimum of 8 students per standard), and a maximum of 4 students per house from each standard (totaling to a maximum of 16 students per standard).
- Grading Rubrics: Legible and presentable handwriting is a must for the writing event. For a detailed breakdown refer the Rubrics section below for Writing Event Evaluation and Speaking Event Evaluation.

Participation	Participation (1): Awarded for participating in the event.	
Scoring	 <u>Correct (4):</u>The participant correctly guesses the correct answer. <u>Partially Correct (2):</u> The participant guesses a word close to the correct answer. 	
Bonus Scoring (Based on Time Slots for Completion)	 <u>Completion during time Slot 1 (4)</u>: The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 1 <u>Completion during time Slot 2 (3)</u>:The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 2 <u>Completion during time Slot 3 (2)</u>: The participant guesses the answer during the time slot 3 <u>Note:</u> The bonus points are not applicable if the regular score (i.e., the score obtained as per the criteria "Scoring") is less than 50% of the maximum attainable score. This it to prevent the participants who answer incorrectly from bagging the bonus points. 	

<u>Time Slots</u>: The Time slots shall be decided based on the available time. A possible division is 20%, 40% and 60% of the total time allocated. Eg.: If the event's duration is an hour, the slots are 00:00 - 12:00, 12:01 - 24:00, and 24:01 - 36:00.

Creativity	 <u>Excellent (5)</u>: Original content with very creative and engrossing ideas. <u>Good (4)</u>: Interesting with some degree of creativity. <u>Needs Improvement (2)</u>: Lack of creativity and originality and not engrossing. 	
Content Organization	 Excellent (5): The writing is well-structured with a clear introduction, development and conclusion. Ideas flow logically, making it easy to follow. Needs Improvement (2): The delivery lacks clarity, confidence, effective body language, and noticeable issues with pacing and eye contact.

KEY POINTS TO BE NOTED

- A "junior" is a student from 6th to 8th standards.
- A "senior" is a student from the 9th and 10th standards.
- A "super senior" is a student from the 11th and 12th standards.
- Judges' decision will be final and indisputable. All the feedbacks are to be registered only through the feedback form.
- The venue, schedule, rules, etc., are subject to change due to unforseen circumstances.
- In case a student is participating in multiple events with overlapping schedules, the student is expected to reach out to the individual event coordinators at least 30 minutes before the earlier event.
- Students are expected to follow the final set of event rules as narrated by the event organizers before start of the events. Failing to do so will lead to disqualification.
- Staff coordinators are to ensure a minimum participation of 50 members for the Quiz.
- Duly filled registration forms of all the participants are to be submitted by 5:00 PM on 11/10/2023, after which no registrations will be received.
- Any lack of discipline or decorum that does not befit a student of St. James will lead to disqualification"

General Rules

- The maximum number of participants mentioned in each category is for a house
- Participants category includes Juniors, Seniors & Super Seniors.
- <u>Points for individual events:</u>
 1st Prize 3 pts, 2nd prize 2 pts, 3rd prize 1 pts.
- <u>Points for group events with less than or equal to 3 members:</u> 1st Prize - 5 pts, 2nd prize - 3 pts, 3rd prize - 2 pts.
- <u>Points for group events with more than 3 members:</u>
 1st Prize 8 pts, 2nd prize 5 pts, 3rd prize 3 pts.
- There will be separate nomination sheets for each house to nominate participants for individual championship under each category.
- Individual Championship nominees should fulfill the following criteria:

1. only students who participate in at least two events should be nominated.

2. The nominee should participate in atleast one individual event, and one or more group events.

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
